Katchalsky Fellowship Announced

In honor of Aharon Katzir Katchalsky, a senior fellowship in biophysical chemistry applied to neuroscience has been established by the Neurosciences Research Program (NRP), according to its chairman, Francis O. Schmitt. Professor Katchalsky, a victim of the May 30 massacre in Israel's Lod Airport, had been an active associate of NRP since the first year of its founding a decade ago. He contributed many important ideas in the application of biophysical chemistry to basic neuronal and brain processes, particularly those relating to membranes and to macromolecular interaction. A fortnight before his death, he cochaired an NRP work session on Dynamic Patterns in Brain Cell Assemblies.

Administered by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the Katchalsky Fellowship, tenable at the NRP Center in Brookline (in the House of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences), will be flexible; in addition to NRP functions, Fellows may participate in other scholarly activities in the greater Boston area. A stipend appropriate to the professional status of the appointee will be provided. Documented nominations may be sent to
